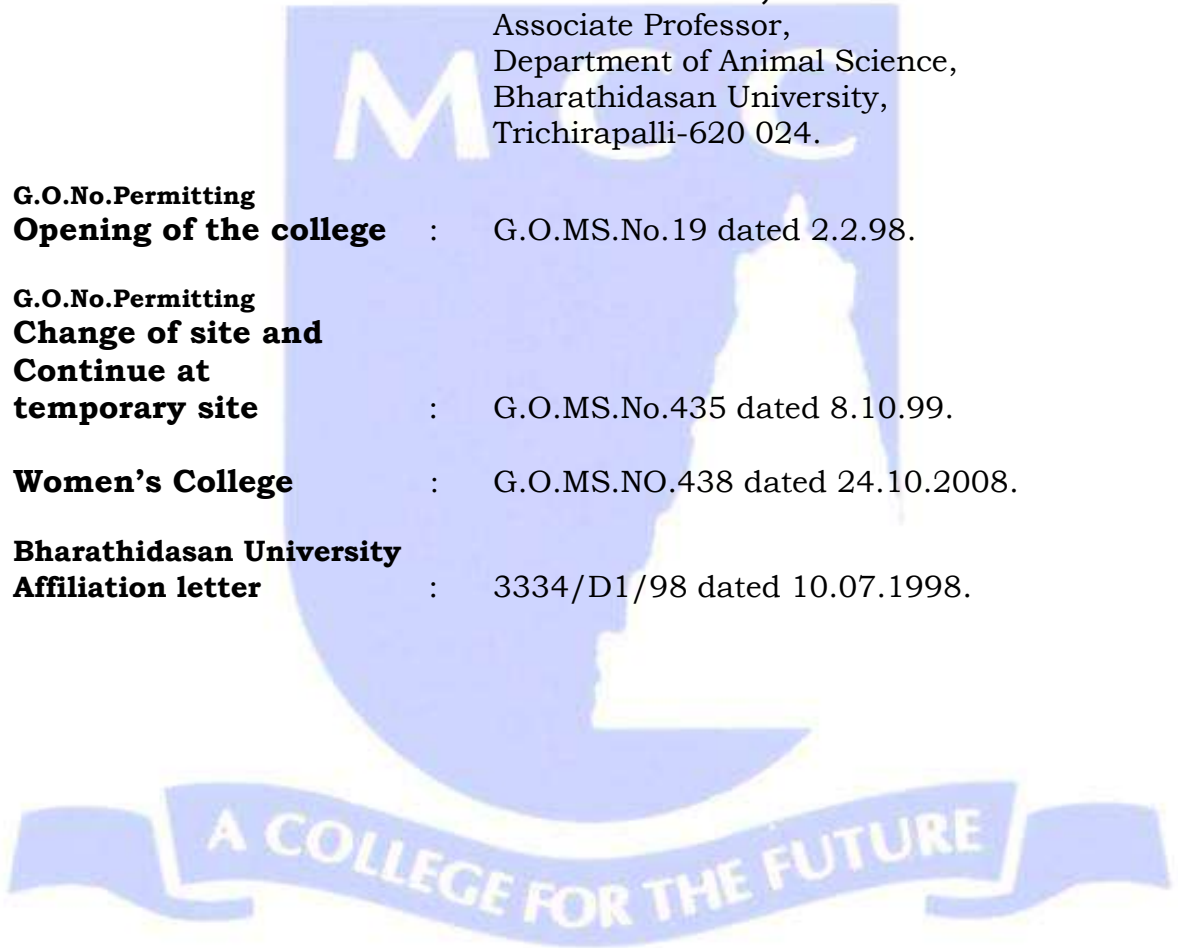

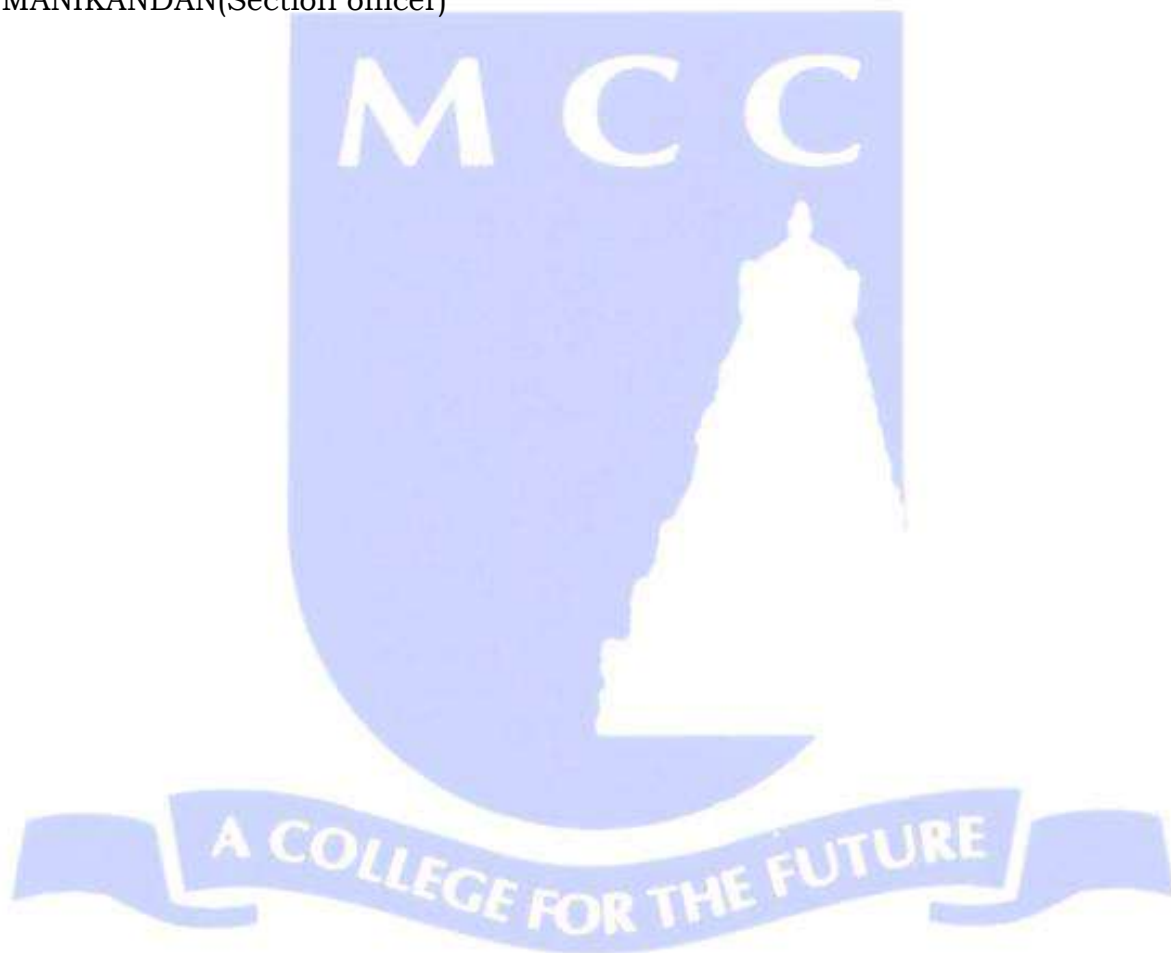

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Sri **Chandrasekaran Pillai**, Who was one of the pioneers in the field of transportation sector at Pattukkottai for the past 30 years had an urge to start a college to impart knowledge to the young people in and around Pattukkottai. This prompted his son **Mr.C.Sundarapandian** a leading industrialist, to start an educational institution in the name of “ **Meenakshi Chandrasekaran College of Arts and Science**” with a motto, “**A College for the Future**”.

The college was inaugurated on 19th June 1998 by Dr.P.Jagadesan the Vice Chancellor of Bharathidasan University Tiruchirappalli. The college started functioning from the academic year 1998-1999 at Pattukkottai (Srinivasapuram) with four Undergraduate Courses (Biochemistry, Computer Science, Microbiology and Commerce) with strength of 126 students and 8 staff members.

At present the college has been shifted to its own new building with excellent infrastructure facilities, well furnished classrooms, well-equipped laboratories and library, at Thanjavur Main Road Karambayam that is situated on the main road between Pattukkottai and Thanjavur. New courses are being introduced every year and at present the college offers 10 Undergraduate courses, 7 Post-Graduate courses and 4 Research Courses one Ph.D., course with a strength of 1500 Students and 70 Faculty members. The college has produced 130 University ranks in a short span of 18 years.

Today the college is growing at a faster pace with various courses to cater to the needs of the students for higher education.

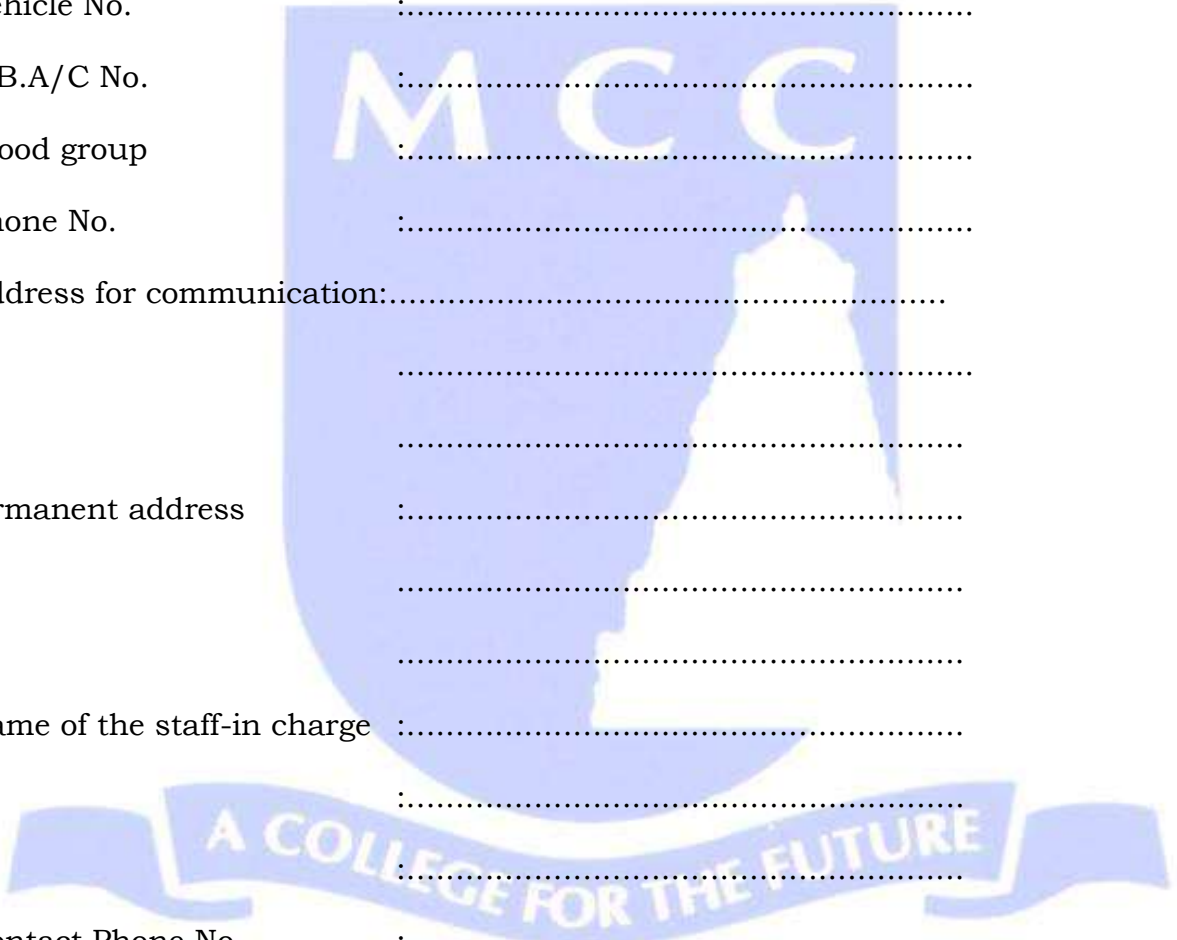

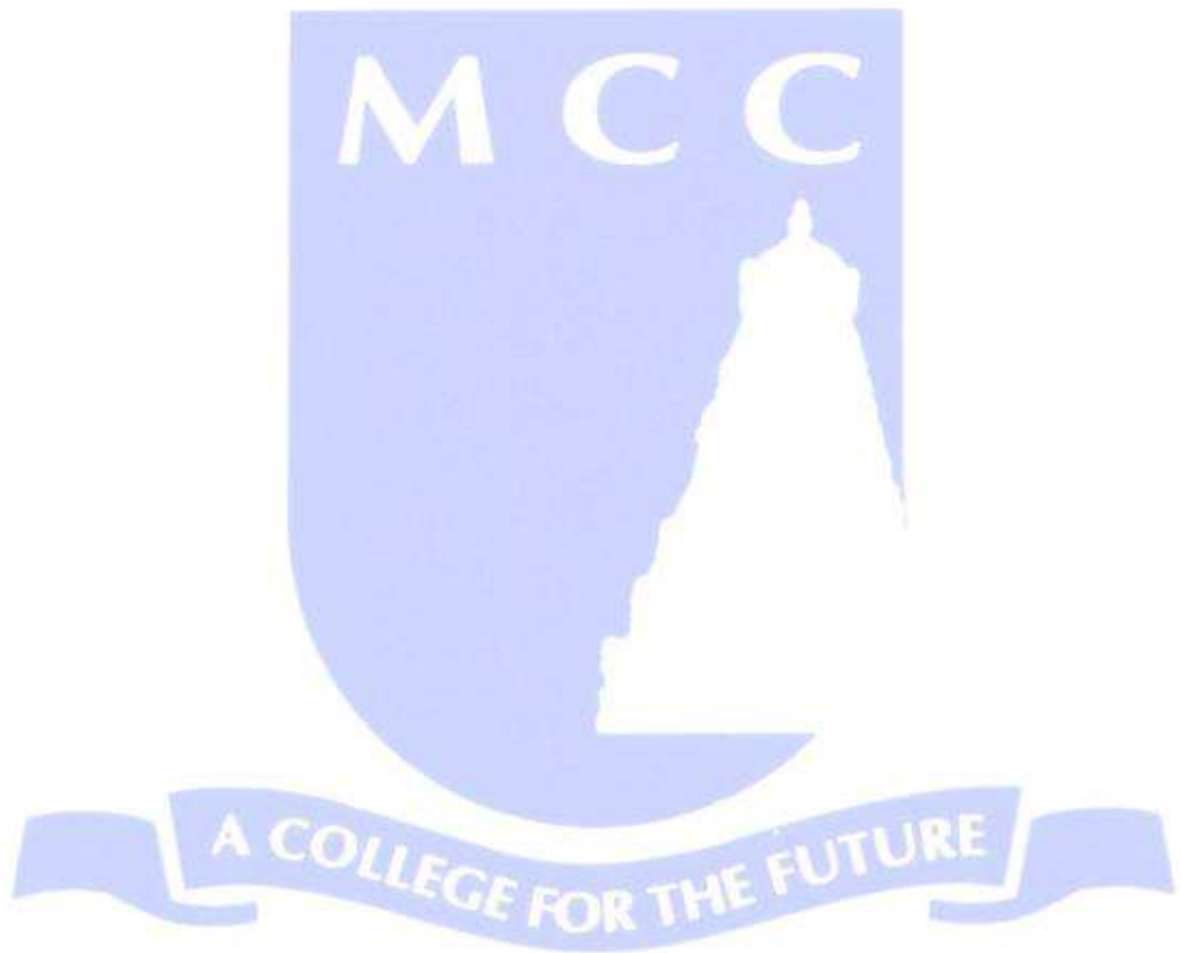

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

EXTRACTS FROM THE MADRAS

EDUCATIONAL RULES CHAPTER VII

DISCIPLINE REGULATIONS

1. Students of schools and colleges should abstain from active participation in party or communal politics.
2. Headmasters, Principals or other constituted school college or hostel authorities may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of a permanent or temporary character regulating the conduct outside the school, College or hostel precincts of students on the rolls. So far as such rules seem necessary to maintain the credit usefulness and reputation of the school or college hostel.
Note: In the case of college such disciplinary regulations as may be issued by the respective universities to which they are affiliated and are not inconsistent with the regulations in the chapter will also apply.
3. Headmasters, Principals and other constituted school college or hostel Authorities shall have full power to inflict the following punishments in the interest of the institution concerned (i) Fine, (ii) Loss of attendance, (iii) Loss of term certificates, (iv) Suspension and expulsion.



CODE OF CONDUCT

IDENTITY CARD

Identity cards will be issued to all the students soon after admission. The students will make use of their identity cards during their periods of study in the college and even after, for identification.

Students are required to keep their identity card with them always as a rule. The identity card is an absolute requirement on occasions like taking examinations, applying for scholarships, certificates etc.,

ATTENDANCE

The prescribed minimum attendance for a student is 75 % for a semester. If a student absents himself for a week without leave letter, her name will be removed from the roll.

Leave application must be sent to the Principal in advance. In case of sickness, a medical certificate must be produced along with the leave letter.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

1. Students should be regular and punctual in attending classes and all activities connected with the college.
2. Gathering in groups at the entrance, exit, path ways, play field, gardens and gates is strictly forbidden.
3. As soon as the first bell rings, Students should be seated in their respective places in the class room.
4. As a mark of courtesy, students should greet their staff, friends and classmates at the first meeting of the day.
5. On entering the class room students should maintain strict silence, irrespective of the presence or absence of the staff member.
6. Students should get up quietly as the Lecturer enters the classroom and keep standing till the latter sits or desires them to be seated.
7. Students should not enter or leave the classroom without the permission of the Lecturer.
8. Students will not be permitted to leave the classroom or attend late under the pretext of paying fees or taking books from the library. Time fixed for such purpose must be strictly adhered to.
9. Students should walk silently and in an orderly manner when they move from one class room to another.

APPEARANCE:

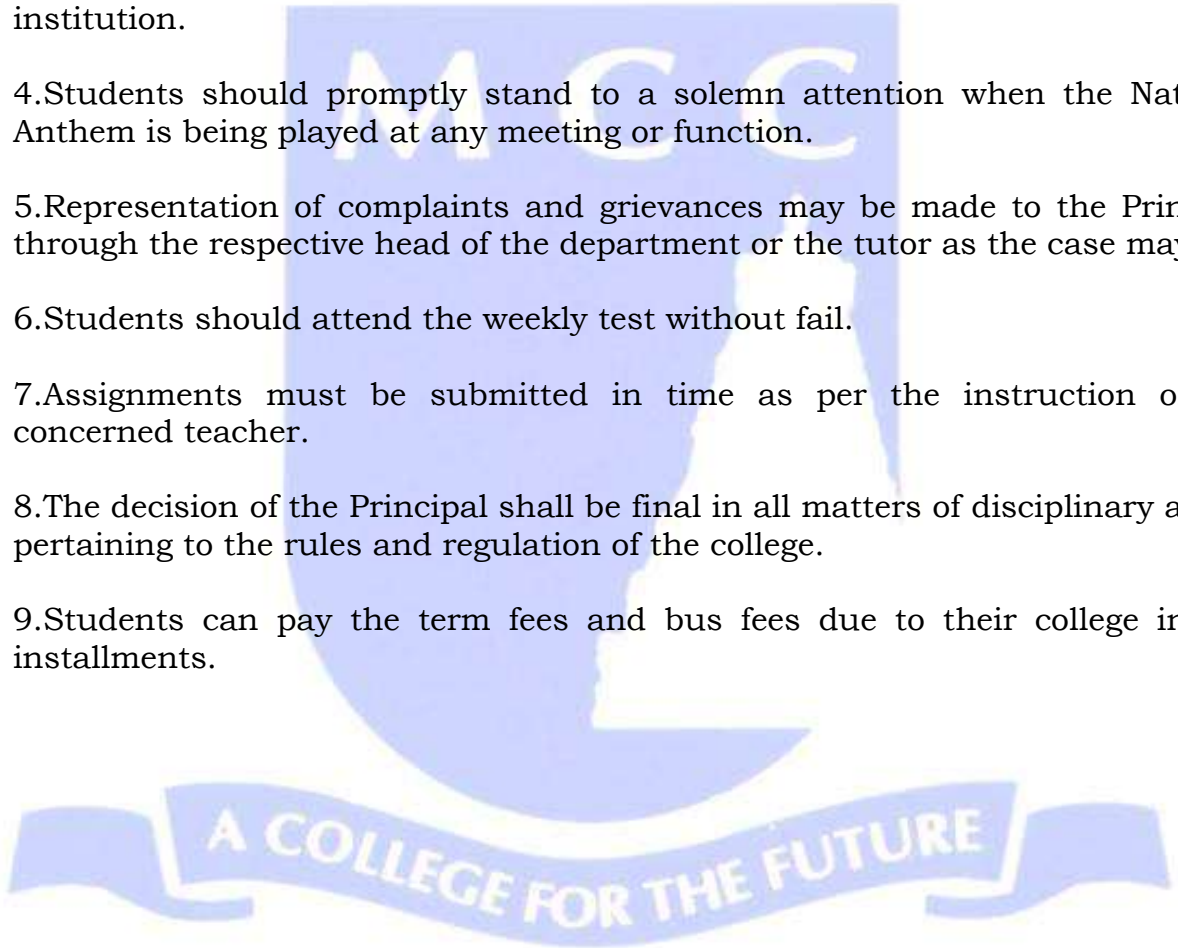
1. Students should wear clean and ironed clothes only.
2. Students arriving without slippers or shoes will not be allowed to attend classes.
3. Students are permitted to wear only half saree, saree, jeans, full skirt and churidhar (with duppatta only).
4. Students are not allowed to wear caps inside the college campus.

RESTRICTED HABITS:

1. Chewing gum is strictly prohibited inside the college campus. Violation of this rule will be dealt with VERY SERIOUSLY.
2. No meeting of any kind shall be held in the college premises without the permission of the Principal.
3. Collecting money from fellow students for any purpose is not allowed.
4. Throwing bits of paper and rubbish inside the campus is not permitted. Students should extend full co-operation in keeping the college clean and tidy.
5. Students are strictly forbidden from taking any part in political activities of any kind.
6. No notice is to be circulated among the students or displayed on the notice board without the permission from Principal. No information or report is to be sent to the press or broadcasting agencies without the permission of Principal.
7. Students are forbidden to enter the office room and staff room during unspecified hours.
8. Damaging the building or furniture in any way by any student calls for very strict disciplinary action. The cost of any damage so caused will be recovered from the concerned students. If the responsibility for the damage cannot be fixed on any individual or group of individuals the cost of damage will be collected from the students collectively.
9. Rude behavior, violent attitude, ragging and teasing fellow students would attract strict disciplinary action.
10. Mass leave for attending marriages or other functions are not strictly allowed during working days.
11. Students should not bring cell phone to the college.

DUTIES:

1. Students should read the college notice board everyday. Ignorance of the notice displayed, will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with the directions contained in it.
2. Bicycles and other vehicles must be parked safely at the appropriate places. Vehicles found in unauthorized places will be impounded and released only on payment of fines.
3. While attending college or public functions students shall conduct themselves in such a way as to bring credit to themselves and to the institution.
4. Students should promptly stand to a solemn attention when the National Anthem is being played at any meeting or function.
5. Representation of complaints and grievances may be made to the Principal through the respective head of the department or the tutor as the case may be.
6. Students should attend the weekly test without fail.
7. Assignments must be submitted in time as per the instruction of the concerned teacher.
8. The decision of the Principal shall be final in all matters of disciplinary action pertaining to the rules and regulation of the college.
9. Students can pay the term fees and bus fees due to their college in two installments.



APPEAL TO PARENTS/GUARDIAN

1. Irregularities in respect of attendance/punctuality.
2. Poor performance in studies and, Misbehavior would call for efforts of faculty to set things right. If the same persists despite such efforts, it would be brought to the notice of Parent/Guardian. The college expects utmost co-operation from Parent/Guardian to put an end to such aberration, which will help the college to produce not only good scholars but also responsible individuals and citizens for your family and the country.

NOTE:

Under the Government's educational rules the Principal has full powers to inflict punishments like imposition of fine, suspension and expulsion from the college.

FEES:

1. All other payments can be made in the college office between 9 a .m and 4 p .m on all working days.
2. All fees must be paid on the dates notified in the college calendar / notice board. If the fees are not paid within the stipulated time, the defaulter's name shall be struck off the rolls. For readmission she shall, in addition to the fees and penalty due from her, pay a readmission fee of Rs.1,500/-
3. Removal of the names from the rolls shall entail forfeiture of attendance till the date of readmission.
4. Fees once paid are not refundable on any account.
5. Installment payment method in applicable for all students.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

AIMS:

- ❖ To establish proper relationship between the teacher and the taught.
- ❖ To bring out latent talents in the student.
- ❖ To make the students an accomplished enlightened and useful citizen.

TUTORS AND WARDS:

Each student will be under the care of one teacher who will be useful for consultation and advice on the matters of academic and social nature

RESPONSIBILITIES OF TUTORS:

1. Tutors are responsible for proper development of the Character and conduct of their wards.
2. They will gain personal knowledge of the domestic life of their wards.
3. They will frequently conduct the parents or guardians and keep them informed about the conduct and progress of their wards.
4. They will hold monthly tutorial meetings to talk about discipline, duties and responsibilities, value of self help and selfless service
5. They will find out talents in their wards and provide opportunities to develop those talents.
6. They will submit periodical tutorial reports to the Principal. They will inform the progress of their wards to their Parents or Guardians.
7. They will scrutinize leave applications of their wards and forward them to the Principal, with their recommendations.
8. They will inform the lack of attendance of their wards to the concerned Parents.

DUTIES OF WARDS:

1. The wards must be regular to tutorial meetings
2. They have to approach their tutors for advice and guidance of all matters.
3. In the absence of the tutors they will represent their difficulties to the HOD.
4. They must abide by the disciplinary rules of their tutorial group as their character and conduct certificate will be based on the reports of the concerned tutor.

CERTIFICATES

1. All certificates will be issued on applications in prescribed forms, which are available in the college office. Ordinarily two days notice is necessary for the issue of a certificate. Certificates will be issued to students only on producing their identity cards.
2. Provisional and degree certificate can be obtained from the university through the college.
3. Transfer and conduct certificate will be issued to all the students after Completion of their course of study
4. Following certificate will be issued to students on request and payment of Rs.100/- in the college office.
 - i) Transfer and Conduct certificate will be issued after one year from the date of joining the college
 - ii) Duplicate copy of transfer and conduct certificate
 - iii) Duplicate identity card
5. Course certificate will be issued on payments of Rs.25/-

CYCLIC TEST:

It is a regular process of the college to conduct the cyclic test for all discipline respectively. Statement of marks with the percentage of attendance will be intimated to the parents through letters properly. Failed/absentee students in the cyclic test have to write and submit the assignments as per the instructions of the teacher. Each student has to pay Rs.200/- per semester for the cyclic test.

EXAMINATIONS

(Bharathidasan University Regulations)

- a. There shall be examinations at the end of each semester for odd semesters in the month of October/ November and for even semester In April/ May. A candidate who does not pass the examination in any Subject(s) shall be permitted to appear in such failed subject(s) in the subsequent examinations to be held in October/November or April/May. No candidates shall be permitted to register for the Subsequent semester Examinations without having registered for the previous semesters. For example a candidate shall not be permitted to register for the II semester examination with out registering for the I semester examination.
- b. The results of all the examinations will be published through the college where the students underwent the course. In the case of private Candidate, the results will be published through the centres in which they took the examinations.

PASSING MINIMUM - MARKS (UG COURSES)

A Candidate shall be declared to have passed in each paper/practical if she/he secures not less than 40% of the prescribed maximum marks. She/he shall be declared Passed for the whole examination and qualified for the degree if she/he passes in all the papers.

CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

1. For all the parts viz, Part-I, Part-II and Part-III who secure 60% or above the maximum marks shall be declared to have passed in I class and those with 50% or above but below 60% in II class, in the respective Parts. All other successful candidates shall be declared to have passed in the III class. Candidate securing 75% or above in first appearance shall be declared to have passed in I class with distinction in the respective parts.
2. For purpose of declaring a candidate to have qualified for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts/ Science/Commerce/Management/Literature in First Class /Second Class / Third Class or First class distinction marks obtained in Part III alone will be the criterion, provided she/he has secured the prescribed passing minimum in part I & II.

RANKING ELIGIBILITY:

1. A candidate, who passes the whole examinations in I class within the prescribed period of duration of the course in the first appearance in all the papers and also scores the highest total in Part-III subject is alone eligible for ranking. Absence from an examination shall not be taken as an attempt.
2. Upto 3 Ranks if the strength is below 20 up to 5 Ranks if the strength is above 20 but below 50 up to 10 Ranks where the strength exceeds 50 but less than 100 up to 100 and 20 Ranks if the strength is 100 and above.

CONFERMENT OF DEGREE

B.A., /B.Sc., /B.C.A., /B.COM, /B.B.A., & B.Lit., Degree (Eligibility) A candidate shall be eligible for the conferment of degree of bachelor of Arts/Science/Commerce/Management/Literature. Only if she has passed all the examination prescribed including the practical wherever prescribed.

PASSING MINIMUM - MARK (P.G COURSES)

A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each paper if he/she secured not less than 40% marks in the University examination and 40% marks in the internal Assessment and not less than 50% in the aggregate taking continuous assessment and end of semester examination marks together.

A candidate shall be declared to have passed in the project work if he/she gets not less than 40% in each of the project Report/Dissertation and Viva-Voce but not less than 50% in the aggregate of both the marks for project Report/Dissertation and Viva-Voce.

A candidate who gets less than 40% in the project Report/Dissertation must resubmit the project Report/Dissertation. Other candidate need not take again the Viva-Voce on the resubmitted Project/Dissertation.

CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATE:

Successful candidate passing the examination and securing a total i) 60% and above and ii) 50% and above but below 60% shall be declared to have passed the examination in first and second-class respectively.

CONFERMENT OF THE DEGREE:

A candidate shall be eligible for the conferment of the Degree only after she/he has passed all the examinations prescribed including the practical and project/Dissertation.

RANKING ELIGIBILITY:

A candidate, who passed the whole examination in I class in the prescribed Period of duration of the course in the first appearance in all the papers and also scores the highest total marks is alone is eligible for Ranking. Rank certificate will be issued for a Subject in P.G.Course.
